

Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between PMIZ Stakeholders




This understanding is made on the 16th of October, 2012 at the Madang Resort in Madang Province between:







- Leaders representing impacted communities in the PMIZ project area

6. *We encourage the State and all parties involved in the current environmental court case to consider a settlement outside of court*


